
SAFETY AND HEALTH POLICY

MLG Oz is committed to providing a safe and healthy working environment for all employees, contractors and visitors and where practicable provides a hazard free workplace. MLG Oz considers safety to be an essential component of our working environments and as such has been integrated within our operational goals and targets. Safety commitment will be part of each and every person involved including that of our contractors.

All employees have the right to cease work and assess any hazard and risks with their supervisor if they believe a task cannot be done safely.

MLG Oz is committed to complying with all current statutory Acts, Regulations and Standards of the regions in which we work, in particular the *Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984 (WA)*, *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996 (WA)* and *Department of Mines and Petroleum*.

To ensure a high standard of safety and health is maintained, MLG Oz is committed to the following:

- All employees and contractors shall be adequately inducted;
- All equipment shall be maintained in to the highest standard and in a safe operating condition;
- All employees and contractors shall be involved in, and provided the opportunity to contribute to, raising safety issues and continual improvements in workplace safety;
- All accidents, incidents and near misses shall be reported and investigated;
- The hierarchy of control shall be applied to all risk management;
- Safety systems, controls and procedures, once implemented, shall be regularly reviewed;
- All working environments shall be regularly and methodically inspected to ensure continued improvement aimed at the elimination of work-related injuries or illness;
- Providing ongoing OHS awareness to all employees;
- Ensure that all employees, contractors, and visitors understand their obligations with respect to Occupational Health and Safety; *and*
- Meeting any additional requirements that may be required on a customer's work site in addition to our own.

It is the responsibility of all employees and contractors to comply with this policy and it's everyone's responsibility to implement within their line of authority.
